Steve Oberman has practiced in the field of criminal defense, with an emphasis on DUI (Driving Under Influence) defense, for 44 years. He has successfully represented thousands of clients. He is the author of a state book. DUI: The Crime & Consequences in Tennessee. He is also co-author of a national treatise, Drunk Driving Defense, now in its 9th edition and cited on multiple occasions by the U.S. Supreme Court. Steve has served as an adjunct professor at the University of Tennessee Law School since 1993 and has received prestigious awards for his faculty contributions. Steve has taught thousands of lawyers about trial techniques at seminars in 30 states and 8 foreign countries. In 2019 he taught for a semester as a Fulbright Scholar at the University of Latvia Faculty of Law in Riga, Latvia, and in 2023 for a semester as a visiting professor at Eötvös Loránd University (ELTE) Faculty of Law in Budapest, Hungary. Steve has also presented at a number of judicial conferences in the United States and Canada as well as for law enforcement agencies, including the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the Czech Republic Police Academy.
